

Interview with Female Abortionist

In an interview Christine an abortionist defended being a mother who aborts other women's unborn babies in her heart-wrenching <u>column from the New York Times</u>. The California abortionist tried to justify her life-destroying work with her new motherhood, but she also was honest about the gruesome reality of what she does. Three times in her column, she mentioned how she struggles with doing second-trimester abortions because the babies' dead bodies remind her of her young daughter.

She began: Recently a colleague asked me if I'd had trouble working while I was pregnant. "Actually I was fine," I said. "I know a lot of people have a hard time, but it wasn't an issue for me." The colleague raised her eyebrows. "Wow. Good for you. I was a mess." We weren't just talking about nausea and swollen feet and low back pain. She and I are abortion doctors. We routinely perform procedures well into our patients' second trimester, when the fetus is well-formed and easily recognizable as humanlike, even "life"-like. Baby-like.

Later, she admitted that was not exactly true. She was a mess. She described being worried about infertility and later miscarriage after she did become pregnant with her daughter. "I'm worried about, you know, the reason," she told her husband after three months of not getting pregnant. "Like some kind of bad karma: the abortion doctor who can't get pregnant." A few weeks later, however, she did. When she saw her unborn baby's heartbeat flicker on the ultrasound for the first time, "then the fear really began."

Her next admission was particularly disturbing: There was one time when I almost fell apart: I was in my second trimester, performing a 17-week procedure on a patient. The fetus, which is normally extracted in parts, came through the cervix intact. I dropped it in the metal dish and I saw it move, or thought I did. It was all I could do not to run from the procedure room crying. That was the only time she said. But that is not quite true either. She said it still is not easy for her to look at a "fetus in the dish, the perfect curl of its fingers and toes. Sometimes it reminds me of my daughter — how could it not?"

"How do I continue to do this work?" She asked, but her answer did not make any sense. She said she sees "a connection" between aborting unborn babies and her work as a mother. "It's not a tension or a contradiction to be reconciled. It's a symbiosis, a harmony," she wrote.

She concluded: As a doctor, I can draw a distinction, a boundary, between a fetus and a baby. When I became a mother, I learned that there are no boundaries, really. The moment you become a mother, the moment another heartbeat flickers inside of you, all boundaries fall away. Nevertheless, as mothers, we must all make choices. And we must live with the choices that aren't ours to make.

It appears to be her wrestling to justify her work, to deny that what she is doing is horrific. She is making a living killing other women's children – babies who already have fingers and toes and heartbeats, babies who hiccup and suck their thumbs, unique, living human beings at their most vulnerable moment of life.

She is right that some choices are not ours to make. Some choices are wrong, and abortion killing an unborn baby – is one of them. Perhaps someday she will finally realize the truth, as other abortionists have, and quit. Hope and healing is available to people who want to leave the abortion industry. Abby Johnson's ministry And Then There Were None has helped hundreds of abortion workers quit their jobs, find employment and heal from the horrors of abortion.

REFLECTION BY DR. MICHAEL CUNNINGHAM MATER DOLOROSA RETREAT CENTER

How do we think about the suffering in our lives?

The other day at Mass, the Gospel (Mark 8: 27-33) recounted the conversation among Jesus and his disciples about what they were hearing from the people about the identity of Jesus. Apparently, there was quite a bit of speculation going on about Jesus as some thought he was a returned John the Baptist while others thought he was Elijah or Jeremiah or one of the other prophets. Not a bad group to be identified with. But when Jesus made the question more personal, Peter spoke up and he got it just right. Peter responded, "You are the Christ!" Jesus praises Peter for his insight and willingness to say it out loud!

Then Jesus does something a bit strange. As soon as Peter applied the title "Christ" to him, Jesus begins to teach that he must suffer, be rejected, be killed and rise after three days. Clearly, these kinds of experiences didn't fit with being the "Christ" in Peter's mind. He pulled Jesus aside and scolded him for talking of such things. Jesus reacts almost violently. "Get behind me Satan! You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do!"

Let's face it, most of us tend to think as "human beings" do! Just recall St. Paul's comment in First Corinthians that the sufferings of Jesus are a "a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles..." (I Cor 1:23). Few of us factor "suffering" into our understanding of a rich and satisfying life, especially if that life is our own or that of someone we love. This encounter between Peter and Jesus seems to be inviting us to take a different look at the way we think about suffering in our lives. If suffering is essential to the life of Jesus, is it just possible that suffering is essential to our lives as well? If suffering is essential to our lives and not just the result of mindless circumstance or accident, perhaps we should look to the suffering in our lives to teach us important truths about our world, ourselves and, of course, God.

Would seeing suffering as an essential experience for us change the way we experience it? Does Peter understand why Jesus is upset with him?

Do I?






