



FINANCIAL SECRETARY



Dear Brother Knights,

Thank you to all the brothers who have paid their annual dues from the emailed statement. You saved a lot of time and expense printing, folding, envelope stuffing, stamping, and mailing. Our Council now has 158 members, with 113 being regular members, 2 have “*Honorary*” status, and 43 have “*Honorary Life*” status. “*Honorary*” status is bestowed by Supreme Council on members who have at least 25 years of consecutive service and turn 65 years old. “*Honorary Life*” status is then achieved when an Honorary member turns 70.

The Special Assessments included with this year’s dues included:

\$2.00 for Culture of Life, which supports activities at Supreme for protection of the unborn

\$3.65, which is a State Council fund assisting brother Knights in financial need

\$5.00 to assist brother Knights in our Council who have financial hardship for dues payment

\$10.00 for Ukraine Relief Fund. All funds collected go to Supreme for refugee assistance.

The drawing for early dues payment will be done at our February Members Meeting on February 14th, which is also Ash Wednesday. The winner will have their \$32.00 dues refunded. The name drawn for Good of the Order in January was Deacon Del Davis, but unfortunately, he was not present. Next month’s drawing will be for **\$20.00**.

Thank you, also, to those of you who returned your Fraternal Survey Forms, as the information contained in them is very important for Supreme to maintain our designation as an IRS recognized charity. This form has changed significantly from previous years due to the Faith in Action programs, which include activities specific to Faith, Family, Community, and Life.

Stay on the lookout for details about our **Lenten Fish Fry’s**, which will begin **February 16th**. Our diners are looking forward to the fellowship of indoor dining once again. Be sure to tell all your friends, as we need to have good turnouts.

I hope to see all of you at our Members Meeting on February 14th.

GLENDALE WINTER WONDERLAND

Our son Bill and his wife Ronit invited us to spend three days after Christmas with them and their sons Samuel (almost 3) and Santiago (one and 3 months.) Ronit created a schedule and e-mailed it to us. Our daughter Renee kindly drove wife Julie, son Andrew, and me to the Regency Inn, Eagle Rock on Thursday, December 28, which was the Feast of the Holy Innocents whom crazy King Herod had killed in his mad search for baby Jesus. He was not a good family man!

It was only an hour drive, and the manager had our comfortable room cleaned and ready for our early arrival just after 2 pm. Next we met Bill and Ronit and the boys in downtown Glendale, CA. Holiday crowds of every nationality and culture roamed the decorated streets listening to Christmas music. We dined outside at a French restaurant on fresh sandwiches and salads. Renee ate two empanadas (barbeque and apple) from a Mexican restaurant next door to our courtyard.

We departed for our evening reservation at beautiful Descanso Gardens at 5:40 pm. For almost two hours we strolled through eight different sections. The first was an enormous field of alternating white, aqua, red, purple, and green lights shaped like tulips. The colors undulated as waves. Next were red and white geometric shaped lights that looked like Muslim designs. Beside that a nine-sided star reflected light as a spotlight bounced off of it. I photographed Samuel next to a ten foot geometric five-sided creation. Although we were dressed for the winter, the cold air hit us as we passed through a lighted tunnel covered with vines and lighted up in white!

Through that structure we came to a green gazebo with swirling white lights around it. After that I snapped a picture of Santiago sitting on Bill's shoulders and staring in amazement through the fog lighted by white lights around an enormous tree. From there we sauntered past a huge round white ball representing the moon with its white light bouncing off a small pond. Nearby was a garden of live trees each surrounded by three circles of white lights. Another set of tall trees and flickering lights that resembled either stars or fire flies in the night sky greeted us!

Then we came to a twenty to thirty foot lighted creation supported by seven lighted arms. We photographed Bill and Ronit and the grandsons inside it. The trail took us to an enchanted village of small to much larger tiny homes constructed from stained glass pieced together. Samuel was in seventh Heaven as he entered each home and made himself at home! There were a number of blue, white, and yellow lighted benches outside the homes.

The next section had a Japanese Teahouse and koi ponds. A metal sign showed it was "a gift to the county of Los Angeles for the enjoyment of all dedicated June 3, 1966," from the Descanso Gardens Guild, Inc. The last area was lighted by tall metal structures with green lights, followed by another forest with lights resembling stars.

Following the amazing Descanso Gardens, Bill and Ronit treated us to freshly baked chocolate chip cookies and hot tea. At 9:40 pm we departed for our motel. We foolishly stayed up to 12:45 am watching an old Perry Mason show. Once you start, you just have to see the ending!

On Friday, December 29, we were treated to a delicious breakfast at Bill and Ronit's home. We dined on fresh bagels topped with cream cheese, scrambled eggs, and fresh fruit with coffee and orange juice. Bill and Ronit walked with the boys and put them down for a nap while the rest of us headed to one of my favorite places, the Gene Autry Western Heritage Museum, founded in 1988. We toured it from 11:30 am to 2:10 pm. Years ago Renee treated me to that museum for Fathers' Day. In the outside courtyard we saw Christmas trees and a sleight. Inside the curator had made a lot of changes from the museum I had seen earlier.

He apparently wanted to present diverse views of the Old West, such as a photograph, entitled "Gay Rodeo Archives." It was taken of 14 cowboys who participated in the Golden State Gay Rodeo, begun in 1985 just two miles from the Autry Museum at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center.

A Word From Your Chapter Advocate

My Brother Knights,

Happy New Year to you all and I hope you stick to your New Year resolution. What is Protocol and how does it pertain to you at our Council meetings? Protocol is a system of rules that explain the correct conduct and procedures to be followed in formal situations. We need to be reminded now and then when you're at our council meeting. When a member wishes to speak, he does so by rising from his seat, addressing the chair by saying "Worthy Grand Knight" and renders the salute. (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically opened hand from top to bottom. The presiding officer recognizes the speaker by announcing his name and rendering the salute in return. (Representing the arms of the Cross, the presiding officer makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right. the presiding officer should at all times refer to and address the officers by their proper title. Hope you follow this rule.

Fourth Degree Exemplification will be held on Saturday, February 17, 2024 at St. Mel Catholic Church, 4140 Corona Avenue, Norco, Ca 92860. The next Exemplification for Orange County will not be held till September. If you are interested in joining the 4th Degree let me know. The fee for joining the 4th Degree is still \$70 in which you receive a 4th Degree pin and a baldric.
