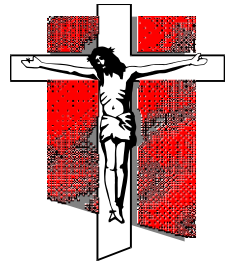

My Dear Brothers,

I am honored to serve again as your Chancellor for the 2024-2025 Fraternal year. In this past year, I have focused on the joy that I receive from serving alongside my Brother Knight and encouraging you to become more involved when the seasons of life give you the time and ability to serve. At 11:30 am Father Bruno celebrated holy mass with us. Our scripture reading told us King David realized his grievous sins against Bathsheba (adultery) and her husband Uriah (murder.) David repented sincerely, and God forgave him. But his sins had consequences. The sword continued in David's descendents. Father Bruno noted that Jesus came from the line of David to calm the storm that terrified His disciples. Besides calming the sea, Jesus came to save us all!

Lunch at 12:15 pm continued our silent retreat. We dined on delicious fresh turkey sandwiches, tossed green salad, and vanilla ice cream floating in Root Beer. Our ears were filled with inspired spiritual reading by Father Michael Higgins. His gentle voice gave us more food for thought.

At 1 pm I met with Father Bruno, who had set aside time for spiritual direction and confession. The 30 minutes was a moment closest to Christ for me. In fact, it was the highlight of my weekend!

At 2:15 pm we had a conference with young Father Febin Barose, who said he hated conferences in the afternoon and hoped we wouldn't fall asleep during his presentation. He came from a small island that was part of India. After 13 years of formation, he was ordained in 2009. He shared that in India the majority are Hindus. They believe in a god who always wins and have trouble accepting a suffering Christ.

His previous United States assignment was at St. Agnes Church in Louisville, Kentucky. Father Febin has always felt that as a priest he is called to be present to everyone as Jesus was. Before he left Louisville, he was taking a walk when he encountered a man with whom he stopped to talk. Later the man told Father Febin he had been ready to commit suicide, but the simple act by the priest had saved him from taking his own life!

Our speaker said John's Gospel portrays Jesus in control of His suffering. He showed a film clip from *Chosen*. It depicts Jesus as the Word of God, who from the beginning of creation was sent to heal the entire world. Jesus was present in scripture with compassion and kindness to Martha and Mary, as well as in calming the lake storm and in forgiving His persecutors. It was all in God's plan! Jesus' last words were, "It is finished!" Jesus has our backs. It is up to us to be on the other side of the cross.

Lastly, Fr. Febin told the story of Wilma Rudolph, who was born unable to walk. Her mother nurtured her and was totally present to her. Wilma started walking at age 13. Through training she became the first African American to win two Gold Medals in the 1960 Olympics. Fr. Febin reminded us of the Passionist Prayer, "May the Passion of Christ be always in our hearts."

At 5 pm all retreatants gathered at the Garden of Mary's Seven Sorrows. Brother John said it was built on the site of the former monastery which was levelled after the 1992 earthquake. We prayed at each station and reflected on Mary's sorrows. The garden held an amazing dark bronze sculpture of Jesus carrying His cross and meeting His mother Mary, who opened her heart to give His human side the greatest consolation!

Our dinner was at 6 pm. We enjoyed sliced roast beef, Irish potatoes, Broccoli, and flan for desert. Father Bruno introduced the cooking staff and told the story about their two years of COVID. All retreats were cancelled, but there was a lot of food that had been ordered. Dr. Michael Cunningham, former director, located five groups in Sierra Madre for which the staff prepared and served meals to folks who were hurting, such as senior citizens, homeless folks, etc. We applauded them warmly!

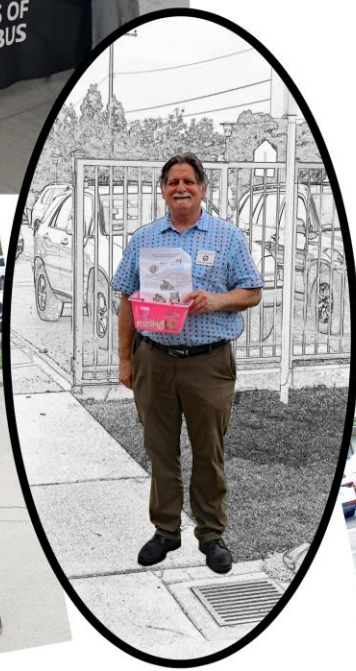
