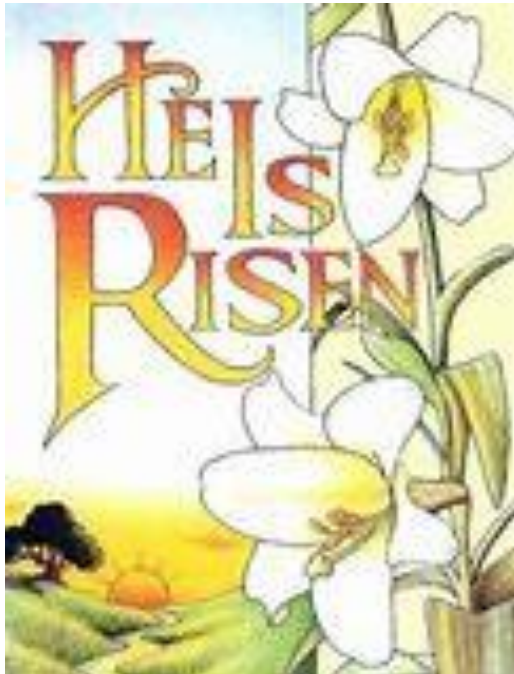

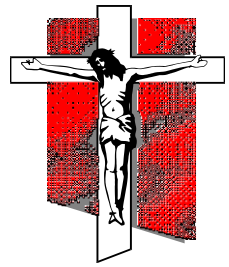

John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son, that whoever believeth in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life."

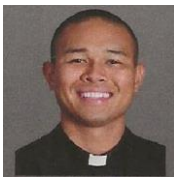
Dr. Alfred Barney Smith was a song writer. Born November 8 1916. In his lifetime he wrote over 500 Christian songs. Nearby was a glass-enclosed replica in miniature of an American West town complete with wooden buildings, animals, and small human figures. The next treat was a bench on which one or two could sit next to an enormous photograph of a Moab arch. A green screen behind the bench allowed the occupant(s) to appear in a series of hair-raising adventures and wild rides, such as a runaway stagecoach, canoe bouncing up and down in rapids, or being part of stampeding buffalo. I tried it first. I could see myself projected in the rides as I flapped my arms and enjoyed the journey. I was rewarded with my photograph on one of the rides. Of course, Renee and Julie sat on the bench for the same thrill rides, as Andrew stood bravely beside them!

There weren't nearly as many of the Gene Autry collected memorabilia exhibited. I remembered Autry had one of the most extensive Western collections from different movies and fellow actors over the years. I did photograph Andrew in front of Gene Autry's glass-covered exhibit with his outfits, guns, and pictures from his numerous family friendly movies.

Another room held "Art of the West." It had many pieces from New Mexico, such as a life-size carving of a very thin Jesus on a wooden cross, a painting of Jesus on a cross with indigenous men below it, some wearing masks. Clear glass protected a totem pole fashioned from thirty or so neatly folded Native American blankets which were stacked on a heavy wood base. There were also carved Santos (saints). (My dad learned how to carve them from Delfin Romero, a retired carpenter from the Zia Company, during the years my folks lived in New Mexico.) A magnificent replica of Our Lady of Guadalupe hung on the wall with St. Juan Diego and others below her

There were several Indigenous protest photographs and stories in another area that presented what they suffered. A map of California listed every Indigenous tribe and its location. I did wonder how balanced the exhibit was, because I couldn't find a positive story about St. Junipero Serra. One that stands out told of Fr. Serra walking hundreds of miles on an injured leg to present a bill of rights for Native Americans to his archbishop in Mexico City to protest their cruel treatment by Spanish soldiers. Also, there was no mention of his forgiveness of rebellious Indians who attacked one of his missions and brutally killed the priest! A true story tells the whole story.

Another room contained the history of Sherman Indian School, where Indigenous youth were "civilized" and removed from their culture. Photographs showed different classes with their activities, such as their powerful and successful football team!

A developing exhibit on the history of Griffith Park invited public input on the lands, the trails, and the many people involved. A touching display near there profiled Bass Reeves (1838-1910.) He “was the first African American commissioned to serve as a deputy U.S. Marshal west of the Mississippi River. Born enslaved in Crawford County, Arkansas, he was moved to Texas by his enslaver, Colonel George R. Reeves, who later forced him into the Confederate Army.” When freed after the Civil War, Bass fled into Indigenous territory occupied by Cherokee, Creek, and Seminole tribes and learned their languages. After all slavery was abolished, he and his family tried farming in Arkansas. In 1875 he was recruited as the first African American marshal due to his knowledge of Indigenous people. For 30 years as a lawman Bass Reeves “was widely known as an expert rider, marksman, and master of homemade disguises, and is thought to have brought more than 3,000 criminals to justice.” The 2022 film *The Harder They Fall* portrayed him, and he may have been the inspiration of the fictional hero the Lone Ranger!

A nearby exhibit had the guns and stories of outlaw John Wesley Hardin, Sheriff John Selman, and law Officer George Scarborough. Another exhibit had the long pistol of Wyatt Earp, as well as a photograph of him and his contemporaries. Many other guns and their stories were on display.

After a stroll through the Ethnobotanical Garden, complete with waterfall, we climbed up stairs to the main level and exited the Autry Museum. Renee drove us to Underwood Family Farms, Somis and Moorpark, California where we arrived at 3:02 pm and met Bill and family.

When paying our entrance fee, I picked up a brochure. It told me, “In 1867 the Underwood family began farming the fertile valleys of Ventura County, California. From field to market, Underwood has always placed an emphasis on quality and flavor that maintain and replenish the soil. The family’s staunch efforts in increasing the use of compost and biological material allow them to minimize use of commerci

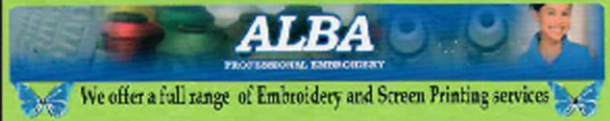

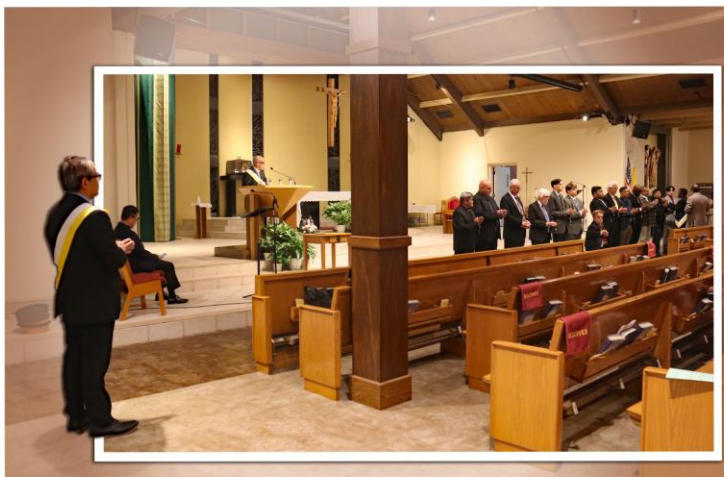
