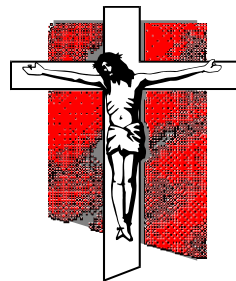

AN AMAZING CONVERSION

On Saturday, January 25, 2025, we celebrated an amazing conversion! Have you ever heard of a known persecutor/killer being turned around 180 degrees? This man was heading straight toward more victims when it happened, and it was all within the law!

Let's listen to Luke in Acts Chapter 22 for a first-hand account of this incredible event, as follows: "Paul addressed the people in these words: 'I am a Jew, born in Tarsus in Cilicia, but brought up in this city. At the feet of Gamaliel I was educated strictly in our ancestral law and was zealous for God, just as all of you are today. I persecuted the followers of this Way to their death, binding both men and women and delivering them to prison. Even the high priest and the whole council of elders can testify on my behalf. For them I even received letters to the brothers and set out for Damascus to bring back to Jerusalem in chains for punishment those there as well.

"On that journey as I drew near to Damascus, about noon a great light from the sky suddenly shone around me. I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?' I replied, 'Who are you, sir?' And he said to me, 'I am Jesus of Nazareth whom you are persecuting.' My companions saw the light but did not hear the voice of the one who spoke to me. I asked, 'What shall I do, sir?' The Lord answered me, 'Get up and go into Damascus, and there you will be told about everything appointed for you to do.' Since I could see nothing because of the brightness of that light, I was led by hand by my companions and entered Damascus.

"A certain Ananias, a devout observer of the law, and highly spoken of by all the Jews who lived there, came to me and stood there and said, 'Saul, my brother, regain your sight.' And at that very moment I regained my sight and saw him. Then he said, 'The God of our ancestors designated you to know his will, to see the Righteous One, and to hear the sound of his voice; for you will be his witness before all to what you have seen and heard. Now, why delay? Get up and have yourself baptized and your sins washed away, calling upon his name.'"

As I reflected on these words, I remembered that Saul became the Christian called Paul. He used his Christian faith so zealously that he underwent five floggings, a stoning, ship wrecks, and being hounded constantly. His words as inspired by the Holy Spirit make up about half of our Christian New Testament!

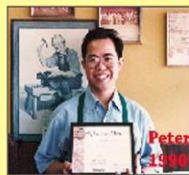
