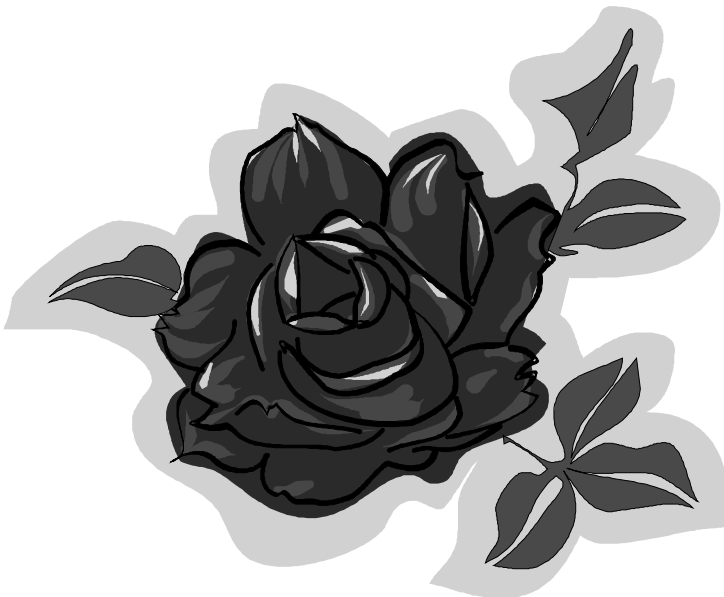

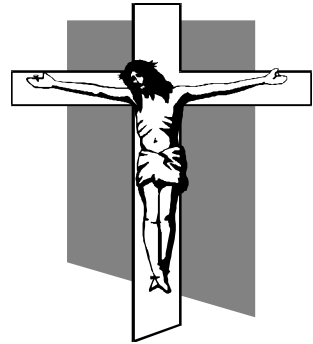

Recipe

My mother has a recipe for Bran Muffins that she's had many complements on. Several people have wanted her recipe, which she has gladly given them. But she learned to tell them that the muffins were made with buttermilk. If she didn't mention it they would invariably go home and decide since they don't like buttermilk they would use sweet milk instead. Then mom would get a call that the muffins had not turned out as good as hers.

You need to follow the recipe, don't change the ingredients. In II Peter 1-3:4 we are given a recipe for Christian Living that can't fail. (3) "His **divine power** has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and goodness. (4) "Through these He has given us His very great and **precious promises**, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires." If we blend His power and His promises into our daily lives and begin living and believing it, you have the beginning of a great recipe. But like the buttermilk you need to put all the ingredients into the mix. In II Peter 1-5: 7 we get the rest of the recipe that will produce a well-rounded and fruitful Christian. For this very reason, **make every effort to add to your faith goodness**, and to goodness, **knowledge**, and to knowledge **self-control**, and to self-control, **perseverance** and to perseverance, **godliness** and to godliness, **brotherly kindness**, and **love**.

In II Peter 1-8 everything is summed up. "For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." Now if you leave out or change any of the ingredients II Peter 1-9 tells us what will happen. "But if you do not have them (all the ingredients) you are near sighted and blind and you have forgotten He has cleansed you from your past sins." In II Peter 1-10 we are given the end result "For if you do these things you will not fall and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ". If you cultivate these qualities with His divine power and precious promises you have a recipe that will not fail.

I just want to remind everyone that we have several events planned for this year and we need all of you to help out when you can.

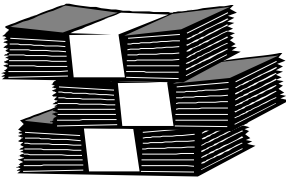

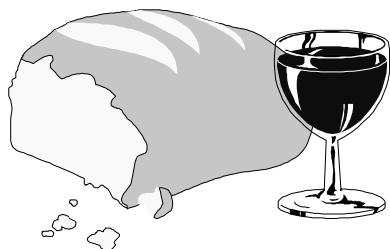

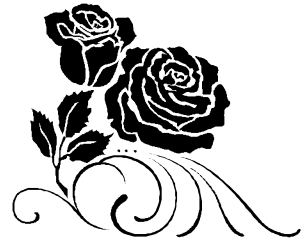

The Encyclical “Gospel of Life”!

I read this encyclical by Pope John Paul II in 1995 when it was first published. Here are several excerpts: Hope you will have a chance to see the Pope’s beatification on May 1, 2011 on EWTN.

Jesus says: “I came that they might have life, and have it abundantly.”

Man is called to a fullness of life, which far exceeds the dimensions of his earthly existence, because it consists in sharing the very life of God.

Even in the midst of difficulties and uncertainties, every person sincerely open to truth and goodness, can by the light of reason and the hidden action of grace, come to recognize in the natural law written in the heart (cf. Rom 2:14-15) the sacred value of human life from its very beginning to its end, and can affirm the right of every human being to have this primary good respected to the highest degree.

At the same time a new cultural climate is developing and taking hold, which gives crimes against life a *new and – if possible – even more sinister character*, giving rise to further grave concern: broad sectors of public opinion justify certain crimes against life in the name of the rights of individual freedom... Choices once unanimously considered criminal and rejected by the common moral sense are gradually becoming socially acceptable...

At the root of every act of violence against one’s neighbor there is *a concession to the “thinking” of the evil one, the one who “was a murderer from the beginning” (Jan 8:44)* ... man’s revolt against God in the earthly paradise is followed by the deadly combat of man against man. In order to facilitate the spread of *abortion*, enormous sums of money have been invested and continue to be invested in the production of pharmaceutical products which make it possible to kill the fetus in the mother’s womb without recourse to medical assistance.

We are facing an enormous dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the “culture of death” and the “culture of life”. We find ourselves not only “faced with” but necessarily “in the midst of” this conflict: we are all involved and we all share in it with the inescapable responsibility of choosing unconditionally pro-life.

Right To Apply

The laws and rules of our Order, as well as state (provincial) laws, specify that the Knights of Columbus may accept insurance applications from members only. As a member, you may apply for insurance on yourself, your wife and your minor children.

The Order's Board of Directors has taken action, though, to assure that a Knight's widow maintains the right to purchase additional insurance for a limited time. This can be of great benefit and comfort to those we leave behind.

This "right to apply" is available only to the widows of insured members. If a member has not availed himself of our highly rated life insurance program, or purchased an annuity or long-term care policy, this benefit is not available to his widow.

But if the member was an insured member, his widow has the right to apply for additional insurance on her life and on the life of the member's minor children. This right must be exercised within one year following the Order's receipt of proof of the insured's death.

Know two things. First, I'll assist your widow and children in any way possible if you should die, both with your Knights of Columbus insurance and any other life insurance you may have. Second, I'll provide them my best professional advice and service, to assure that they have adequate insurance protection.

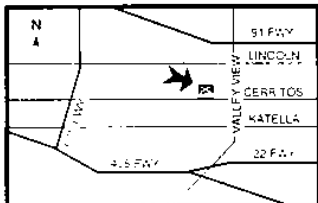

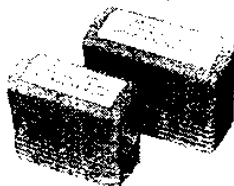
